Community Outreach Initiatives

Our REIAC Southwest Chapter recently celebrated our fifth (5th) anniversary in supporting the **Master of Real Estate Development (MRED) program at ASU's W.P. Carey School of Business.** We have committed up to \$11,000 annually. At the beginning of each academic year, we award 2 - 3 scholarships of \$2,500 each to MRED students who have a financial need and want to pursue real estate development in Arizona after they graduate from the MRED program.

We also sponsor the REIAC – Rockefeller Group Challenge where three (3) teams pitch their development proposals for their final Synthesis project at the end of each academic year to our membership and members of the public who attend. After the audience has voted for the best presentation, the winning team members each leave with \$1,000 checks up to \$6,000 per team. REIAC Signs Agreement with Junior Achievement of Arizona

We are pleased to announce that our REIAC chapter has entered into a sponsorship agreement with Junior Achievement of Arizona (JA) with a financial commitment of \$12,000 annually that will utilize the experience and skills of REIAC members to introduce 12th grade students to the built environment and real estate development. JA provides financial education and career guidance to K-12 students that is not provided in our public-school system throughout the State. JA works with 385 schools, 3,100 teachers and reaches over 80,000 thousand Arizona students each year.

We will present a curriculum prepared by the REIAC Community Outreach Subcommittee, in cooperation with JA, for five (5) classes each semester and act as judges for a 6th class competition where teams of students will compete for \$1,000 in cash prizes by demonstrating what they learned from the classes. **Volunteers are being sought from our membership to teach the 45 minute classes during the upcoming 2018 – 2019 academic year at a local Phoenix area high school to be announced.
