We encourage our members to bring qualified guests to our member-only programs. The Board respectfully requests that members adhere to the following guest policy:

- The same guest cannot attend more than two (2) member-only programs before becoming a REIAC member if they qualify as set forth below.
- Guests of REIAC members must be directly affiliated with a "principal." In order to fulfill our mission, REIAC strictly excludes brokers, property management companies, service providers, vendors, accountants, law firms, title companies and other service providers that are not exclusive sponsor members.

We define "principals" to include: Registered investment advisors possessing the discretion to invest on behalf of endowments or pension funds; banks, life insurance companies and other financial intermediaries; owners and developers actively involved in significant real estate transactions; and operators of real estate investment funds. REIAC Philanthropic/Community Involvement Initiatives

As many of you are aware, the REIAC Southwest chapter supports the ASU W.P. Carey School of Business MRED program. We give two \$2,500 scholarships to MRED students and up to \$6,000 to the winning team at the REIAC/Rockefeller Group MRED Challenge in May of each year. We are proud to announce that 2018 will be our fifth year supporting the MRED program.

The REIAC Board is considering another initiative that would support Junior Achievement of Arizona (JA). How many of you remember going through the JA Biz Town in the fourth grade? JA provides financial education and career guidance to K-12 students that is not provided in our public-school system throughout the country. JA works with 385 schools, 3,100 teachers and reaches tens of thousands of Arizona students each year.

REIAC is in discussions with JA about creating a program for 10th-12th grade students to introduce them to the built environment. The wealth of experience that our members possess in our industry is of great interest to JA since they do not have a program that gives the students exposure to the built environment.
